One moment that I recall that still makes me smile: somehow I was given the assignment to deliver an oral presentation on Buddhism. I knew nothing of Buddhism so I hunkered down and read up on it. During my presentation I repeatedly referred to the concept of, as I read it, OWN-nen-ness. I could see Mr. Nuxoll in the back of the room looking perplexed. Finally he said, “Jerry, what’s OWN-nen-ness? Can you spell it. I did and Mr. Nuxoll let own that huge laugh of his and said, “Jerry, it’s ONE-ness!” I committed the hood of mispronunciation that young readers often do and Mr. Nuxoll found it hilarious. Despite the error, I enjoyed greatly making him laugh. Four years ago he came to my father’s funeral. The somber occasion notwithstanding, I was delighted to see him. I appreciate his kindness to come to that event. I will miss Mr. Nuxoll. The world is significantly less wonderful without him.
