Shiu-Ching Tang of Huntington, NY passed away on February 23, 2024, at the age of 79 after a long, brave fight with Multiple Myeloma cancer. He is survived by his loving wife of 51 years, Mary Ellen, along with seven children, Susan Bocassi, David Tang, Brian Tang, Bruce Tang, Patricia Tang Hirschler, Jonathan Tang, and Keith Tang as well as their spouses and nine grandchildren.

Born on April 23, 1944, in Canton China, Shiu-Ching was raised in Hong Kong. He then pursued his education, ultimately earning his medical degree from National Taiwan University School of Medicine. In 1969 he emigrated to the United States, finished his medical training in Brooklyn, NY where he met his wife and became a physician. He subsequently established a private practice in Elmhurst, Queens, where he served his community until his retirement in 2020.

A soccer enthusiast, he grew up playing the sport and was a big Manchester City fan. In his leisure time, he also loved watching football, basketball and hockey. He enjoyed carpentry, the stock market, playing guitar and a good, challenging game of Go.

He leaves behind a legacy of family-first and will continue to inspire all who were fortunate enough to have known him.
